Each academic year gives us another reason to celebrate. The 2018/2019 school year will continue to be shaped by our multi-year reform efforts. For the past three years, all educational stakeholders have embraced and championed our District-driven initiatives that have become synonymous with an exemplary “Babylon Education”. Some of those initiatives, for example, have been achieving the highest possible graduation rates with Advanced Diplomas, our notable STEAM initiatives such as our “Project Lead the Way” engineering pathway, our eclectic science research program, the planning and implementation of Advanced Placement opportunities, World Language expansion, our commitment to the Arts, and of course, technology enhancements. We will continue to promote the finest delivery of instruction and leadership so that students make meaningful progress that ultimately prepares them for the world beyond a K-12 public education.

Here are some exciting updates:

- ✓ This September will mark the official implementation of our 1:1 world computing initiative for every student in grades K-12. While devices assigned to each student in K-6 will remain in classrooms, devices to students in Grades 7-12 will travel from home to school! The distribution of devices for students entering grades 7-12 will take place during the week of August 20th as per previous notifications from the District. We feel it is a District’s obligation to ensure that both students and professional staff have the necessary tools and knowledge to be productive in a technological world which defines the times.
- ✓ While the documented level of student success is always at the forefront of our decision making, this year we will also focus on addressing additional school safety and mental health initiatives, particularly with the roll-out of *Scholarchip* as a visitor management system at all three buildings. Come September you will see the attendance and visitor kiosks at all building entrances. All visitors seeking permission to enter any building on campus will be required to initially display as well as scan their official ID into the system in order to gain clearance. There will be no exceptions. The kiosks at the high school will also be utilized for student attendance during lunchtime hours.

- ✓ Additionally, we are currently in the final phase of bond-related renovation projects throughout the District, and come September everyone will notice many visually-pleasing improvements at the high school and grade school campuses, such as:

High School:

A new security vestibule at the circular entrance
New interior paint throughout
Two new STEAM suites
New student lockers throughout
New ceilings in certain sections
LED lighting in certain sections
Upgraded floor tiles in certain sections
An upgraded parking lot and site work completed

Grade School:

Renovated gymnasium – new floor, new pads, new bleachers, new paint
Renovated music suite – new floor, new paint
New student lockers throughout
New ceilings in certain sections
LED lighting in certain sections
Upgraded floor tiles in certain sections
New sinks and vanities in certain classrooms

In closing, we look forward to working with you as we partner to offer our students another terrific school experience grounded in strong academics, positive advocacy, and meaningful collaboration. Enjoy these remaining days of summer!
