CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Ms. Pané, President. A motion to enter executive session for the purpose of discussing the employment history of particular individuals, custodial and administrative negotiations and advice from counsel was made by A. Donaldson, seconded by C. Dell'Erba and approved. (6-0) Mr. Bencivenga arrived at 7:30 p.m. Public session resumed at 7:30 p.m. at which time Mrs. Pané, President, led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer's and Business Office Financial Reports and Extra Curricular Fund Report for September 2018, October 2018 and Internal Claims Audit Report for September 2018 were approved on motion by D. Montalto and seconded by E. O'Brien. (7-0)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The Board of Education recognized the 2018 AP Scholars with Honor, AP Scholars with Distinction and AP Scholars. Student Delegates reported that Safe Halloween was a great success. They thanked all who attended or participated in the organization and implementation. On November 16th, 40 members of the Student Council went to Puzzle Break. They had a fantastic time bonding and honing their leadership and problem solving skills. Student Council will be hosting a Jingle Walk at the Babylon High School track on Wednesday, December 12 from 6:30-8:00 p.m. There will be carols, cookies and hot cocoa. They also reported on activities in the Fine Arts and World Languages Departments.

Mrs. Rozzi, Superintendent of Schools, reported that on Tuesday (Election Day) November 6th, the district hosted our fall Superintendent's Conference Day. The day's activities for instructional staff included Mindfulness Training as an outcome from the District's Curriculum Committee chaired by Carol Dell'Erba and Dan D'Amico. This program, delivered by Carin Winter from Mission Be.org served as an introduction and springboard to future conversations regarding the role that mindfulness can play in our current district practices. In both the elementary and grade schools, future conversations will center on how to integrate mindfulness into Second Step, our current Social Emotional Learning program. On Saturday October 27th the district inducted four amazing alumni into the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame: Mr. Marshall Coid (Broadway Musician/Composer), Captain Gerry Izzo (Black Hawk Pilot), Dr. Cheryl Taylor Lee (Doctor and Professor of Urology and Oncology at Oho State University) and Mr. Sheldon Salzman (COO and President of Uniroyal Tire Company). It was such a lovely induction; Syntax was there to document the event. The Babylon UFSD, along with other local districts, held a Transitions Fair to support the needs and future plans of students with Special Needs. Lisa Consolo was instrumental in its planning which also involved assistance from our high school guidance department and Mr. Murphy. The fair was held on November 7th from 6:30 – 9:00 p.m. at Deer Park HS. Babylon Schools were red last month in honor of our friends with Dyslexia and to show our support and understanding. Within the past year we have embraced interventions helping youngsters overcome this condition and our OG specialist has been amazingly instrumental!

Mr. D'Amico presented a report on Superintendent's Conference Day and Mindfulness Training.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mrs. Donaldson, audit committee chair, reported that the committee met and received the Independent Auditors Report for 2017-2018. A couple highlights from our last management letter: four comments were corrected or are in the process of being corrected, two current year comments to work on this year. The report will be available on the district website. Mr. Bencivenga, buildings and grounds committee chair, reported that the committee met last month and based on the security assessment discussed fencing along Railroad Avenue. They received a couple of quotes. The Board discussed the fencing in length. They discussed having gates and they will be open when students are not in school. They looked at both aluminum and steel fencing. The Board will be discussing the fencing further. Also discussed Rowe Hall steps at Railroad Avenue. Mr. Bencivenga also mentioned to check the drainage in the circle. Mr. Bencivenga mentioned that the Veterans enjoyed the Veterans' Day Celebrations on November 9th at the schools. Mrs. Rozzi reported that the community bond tour date has been rescheduled. We will be hosting facility tours for all Babylon community members who would like to see all of the renovations from the past 4 years that were Bond-related on Saturday January 26th at 10:00 a.m. and will be publicized in our upcoming district newsletters well as in the Babylon Beacon, Mr. Montalto, technology committee chair, reported that the committee will be meeting on December 10th at 3:00 p.m. Mrs. Dell'Erba, curriculum committee chair, reported that they continued their discussion on Mindfulness. Ms. O'Brien reported that the policy committee will be meeting on November 27th at 3:15 p.m. to discuss three policies, Parental Involvement, Sexual Harassment and Homelessness. Committee meetings are posted to the district website. As there were no other committee reports, the Board moved to the next item.
