Babylon's chapter received the Community Service award for contributions to the New York DECA charity national Alzheimer's Association. - Last month Mr. Davey and his team presented on STEAM initiates at the elementary school as well as the science department presented on STEAM initiatives at the high school.
- Last month the high school held BHS Presents and the POPS concerts were held this month; these are some of the fine events showcasing the talent of our students.
- ➤ On March 1st, the district hosted the 4th Annual Advocacy Breakfast & Community Summit. Joining us were our State Senator, Assemblymen, Village and Town elected leaders. We discussed pertinent advocacy issues relevant to necessary and appropriate school funding.
- ➤ We are beginning our Spring planning: Regents and AP Prep will be starting up shortly. Kindergarten registration is beginning this week. The All-School Musical will be held 3/28-4/1. This year's production is "Mama Mia".
