2022/2023 DRAFT Budget

March 14, 2022

- The current operating budget for the 2021-2022 school year was approved by voters in May 2021 in the amount of \$56,414,443 with a tax levy of 1.28%.
- ➤ The Proposed Budget for the 2022/2023 school year in the amount \$56,995,817 will be a 0% tax-levy increase which is below the allowable tax cap of .2%. The budget is set to be adopted at on April 11, 2022.
- The <u>budget-to-budget</u> dollar increase is \$581,374 representing a 1.03% "budget-to-budget" increase.

The 2022/2023 Proposed budget Includes salaries and support staff for an additional class offering:

- ➤ Each year, the special education department reviews the needs of the students projected to enter kindergarten.
- ➤ As a result of this review, the proposed 2022/2023 budget includes the development of a class for students with Autism.
- ➤ In prior years, these students would have been referred to out of district placements.
- The decision to develop this program is based upon a cost analysis of out of district tuition and a cost project of development costs for an "in district" program.

The Special Education Component...



- ➤ The program will target up to 8 students with Autism in grades K-2.
- This program will utilize an applied behavior analysis methodology.
- Associated costs include:
 - > A trained special education teacher,
 - > 3 para-professionals
 - ➤ A part-time, board certified, behavior specialist consultant.
 - A part time Speech therapist and OT/PT consultants.
 - Additional start-up costs include equipment, curriculum, and professional development/training for staff.

Moving Forward:

- ➤ April 1st is the adoption deadline date for the State Budget.
- ➤ The district's adoption date by the BOE is April 11^{th.}
