The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mrs. Anderson, President. At this time a motion to move into Executive Session to discuss a particular personnel matter and advice from counsel was made by Mr. Conway, seconded by Mrs. Martino and approved.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 7:30 p.m. on motion by Mr. Melito, seconded by Mrs. Vukovich, the Board unanimously agreed to conclude Executive Session and enter into public session whereupon President Mrs. Anderson led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Treasurer's and Business Office Financial Reports and Extra Curricular Fund Report for January 2009 was approved on motion by Mrs. Vukovich and seconded by Mrs. Martino. (6-0)

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Student Delegates, Michael Augello and Neil Cusamano, reported that the senior class raised money for the Babylon Breast Cancer Society, the drama production will be held on March 27<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> and they also reported on other club and student council activities. Mr. Melito reported on Board of Education Student Centered Goal 1 to monitor the implementation of the revised Interscholastic Athletic Program Guidelines and Procedures. The Interscholastic Athletics Handbook will be adopted this evening. A curriculum presentation "Literature through a Character Lens" was presented by Kim Mielenhausen and Cheryl Murphy, grade school teachers, and Grace Kiernan, Librarian.

The district is facing the possibility of a half million dollar loss in state aid. The Governor will be releasing his report in March. The buildings and grounds committee recommended to the Board of Education that the Superintendent provide a regular report on building projects completed. Mrs. Vukovich, policy committee chair, reported that the policy committee is reviewing the Code of Conduct and the Board of Education will be conducting a second reading of policies 6650, 8330 and 8421.
